

# Shirakawa-go and Gokayama Bus Tour

Both village were registered as a UNESCO World Heritage Sites in 1995



## Schedule

### 1 Takayama Nohi Bus Terminal (8:30am)



#### Gokayama Ainokura village about 50minutes

20 houses of inside in 32 houses of housing in this village is a `gassho-style` house. `Gassho-style` is the steep architecture style of a triangle roof and the thatched private house seen characteristically at Shirakawago and the Gokayama area from which Japan is learned about at an eminent heavy snowfall area.

### 2 `Tenshukaku` lunch



Tenshukaku is located on top of a small hill, overlooking Gassho-style houses. You can taste local cuisine meal.

- Masu kanroni (sweetend boiled trout fish)
- Hida soba (Japanese Soba noodle)
- Ishiwaritofu (Hard bean curd with hoba miso)
- Sansai (Plants growing in the wild and in the mountains)
- Kuromai (black rice)

### 3 Shirakawa-go



#### “Shirakawa-go Gassho Zukuri Folklore Park” about 120 minutes

25 Gassho style houses were transferred from the Kazura district in Shirakawa village and opened as “Shirakawa-go Gassho Zukuri Folklore Park” in 1972. (admission fee included)

Shirakawa-go is situated at the foot of Mt.Hakusan. It's a quite mountains village with rice field and a river running through it. 114 thatched roof stand together in the village. You can see the beautiful landscape in there.
